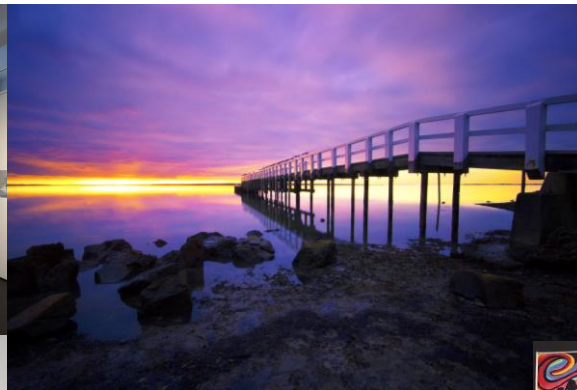

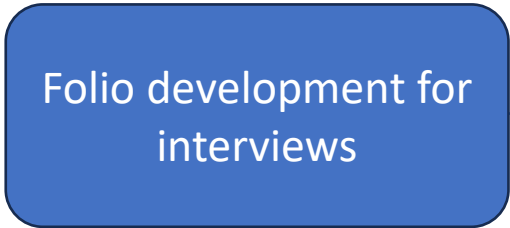

As a Media student you will learn about how media products are made and you'll also get to make some yourself.

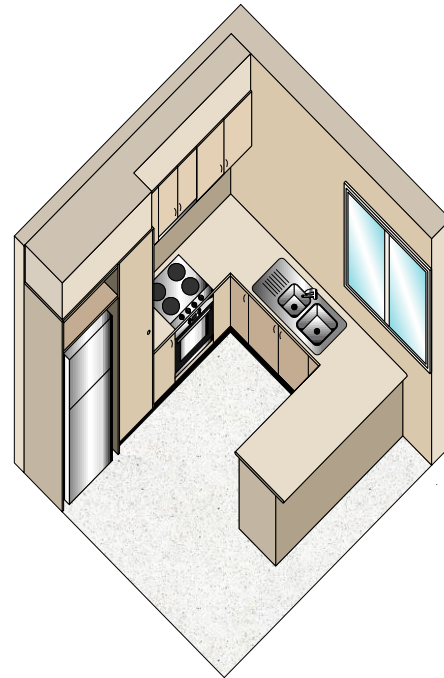
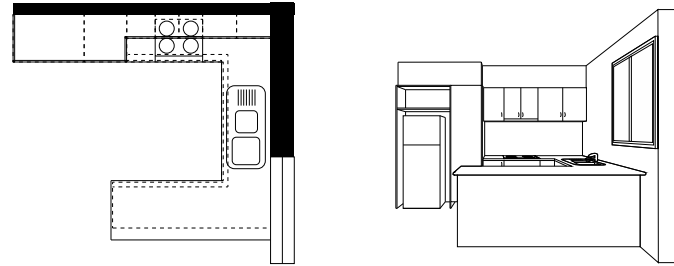

- Witness professional performances for interpretation and analysis.





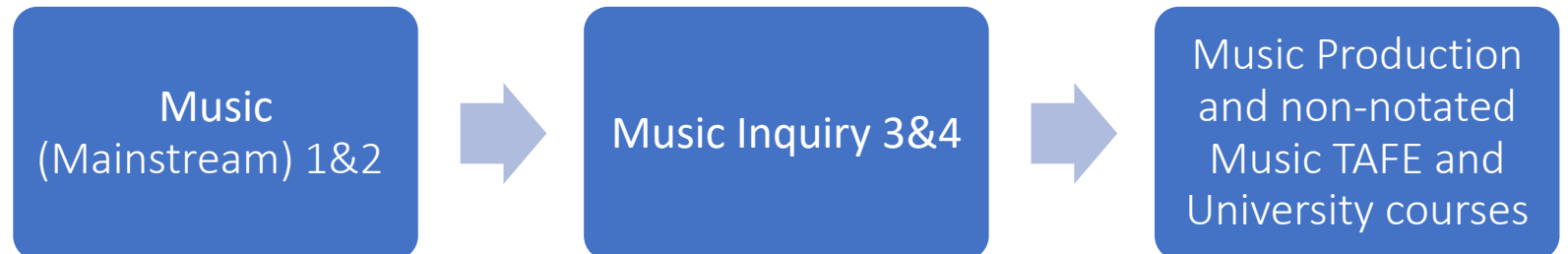
Mainstream Music

- Anyone with an interest in music can complete these subjects
- Instrumental Music Lessons helpful but not necessary
- Strongly recommended joining at Yr 11, Yr 12 entry possible with significant performance experience

What do we learn?

- Basic music theory including notation, tab and chords
- Perform in a band at the Big Gig
- Play an instrument and/or sing (basics or improve existing skills)
- How to use audio equipment like the PA and microphones
- Investigate and perform in styles that interest you

Prerequisites

- For Unit 1, AMEB Gr 4+ or substantial performance experience for Contemporary musicians
- Support from instrumental music lessons
- Daily practise > 30 min

What do we learn?

- Prepare for challenging recital-style performance
- Solve problems in your playing yourself by “working smart”
- Advanced theory, including AMEB work
- Composition, including working with notation software
- Develop your ears with aural and transcription work
