Making and Breaking the Law

SUBJECT DESCRIPTION:

How does the law affect young people? What rights do they have? How can they influence change to the law? This subject is ideal for students who are interested in these questions. It looks at the key features of the Australian legal system by examining the rights of young people when dealing with criminal and civil law. The importance of the idea of 'justice' is studied by exploring Australian case studies and comparing Australia's approach to the law with that in other countries. A study is made of how laws are made and most importantly, how young people can have a say in the issues they care about and the laws that affect their lives every day.
