STRUCTURE OF YEAR 10



STRUCTURE OF YEAR 10

Students are required to **complete 12 units across the year** (6 x units per semester)

✓ Must complete **2 x units** for: ENG & MATH

✓ Must complete **1 x unit** for: SCIENCE, HUMANITIES, PE/HEALTH, ART, & TECH

✓ May then complete **3 x units** from any KLA

Other relevant information

- Each unit comprises of 8 lessons per fortnight (4 hours per week)
- Subjects are either 1 x unit or 2 x units
- All VCE & VET subjects are 2 x units

What are prerequisites?

- Prerequisites are subjects you must have completed to be eligible for selection to a University or TAFE course.

VCE OR VET SUBJECT IN YEAR 10

Undertaking a VCE or VET subject whilst in Year 10 is a great option for those that have demonstrated academic excellence in their junior schooling years within a subject area.

It is suitable option for students that wish to:

- Challenge and extend themselves
- Gain some experience of how VCE / VCE VET works
- Complete a VCE or VET subject that may not fit into their desired full VCE program
- Improve chances of selection into tertiary studies
 - *By taking a Units 1 & 2 subject in Year 10 then Units 3 & 4 (Year 12 level) in Year 11. This allows for the possibility of studying a first-year university subject in Year 12*

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS...

- It's **important that you meet the entry requirements** if you wish to accelerate and complete a VCE subject whilst in Year 10

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR ACCELERATION INCLUDE:

- ✓ Student has obtained a reported Year 9 (semester 1) Victorian Curriculum level of '**Above**' or '**Well Above the Expected Level**' in subject area
- ✓ Student has **support from current teacher** or **KLA leader** in subject area
- ✓ Student's **PLR results** indicate established learning habits

**Any questions related to entry requirements for studying a VCE / VET subject whilst in Year 10 should be discussed at course counselling with your YLC.*

You must choose at least 1 subject from each of these faculties: English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, PE/Health, Art, Technology.

Mathematics selections will be made through consultation with each students Maths teacher, please discuss this with your Maths teacher.

You must choose exactly 12 "Units", a unit is the same as a semester. So you may need to leave an elective blank.

You must choose at least 4 Reserve "Units". So you may need to leave a reserve elective blank.

Each student will have a course counselling session at school to discuss selections and future school pathways.

You can't have duplicate subjects.

VCE GLOSSARY OF TERMS

● **Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)**

A ranking on a scale of 0.00 to 99.95, based on study scores, given to a student. Calculated by VTAC and used by tertiary institutions to select students for their courses.

● **Department of Education**

The Victorian Government department that administers government school education, apprenticeships and traineeships.

● **General Achievement Test (GAT)**

A test completed by all students enrolled in one or more VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3 and 4 subject sequence. Section A of the GAT is completed by students enrolled in one or more VCE VM Unit 3 and 4 subject sequence.

● **Outcomes**

What students are expected to know and have achieved by the time they have finished a VCE unit.

● **Registered training organisation (RTO)**

An organisation approved by the Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority or the Australian Skills Quality Authority to deliver and issue VET qualifications.

VCE GLOSSARY OF TERMS

● **Satisfactory (S)**

Certifies that a student has successfully completed the outcomes of a unit in VCE, VCE VM, or VPC, or units of competency for VCE VET.

● **School-assessed coursework (SAC)**

Used to assess a student's level of achievement. Tasks are selected by the school from the designated study design.

● **School-assessed task (SAT)**

Used to assess students' specific sets of practical skills and knowledge. Tasks are set by the VCAA and assessed by the teacher.

● **School-based apprenticeship or traineeship (SBAT)**

An apprenticeship or traineeship undertaken in the VCE, VCE VM or VPC, with at least one day a week spent on the job or in training during the normal school week.

● **Semester**

Half the academic year (around 20 weeks across 2 consecutive school terms). Most units last for one semester. In the VCE, Unit 3 is completed in the first semester and Unit 4 is completed in the second semester. This can be more flexible in the VCE VM.

● **Statement of Attainment**

A record of recognised learning that may contribute towards a VET qualification.

● **Statement of Results**

A set of documents that lists a student's VCE, VCE VM or VPC results, and if the relevant certificate has been awarded.

● **Student Achievement Profile**

A holistic summary of a student's achievements captured during their senior secondary education that will complement the existing Statement of Results.

● **Structured Workplace Learning (SWL)**

On-the-job training that allows VET students to develop their work skills and understand employer expectations.

VCE GLOSSARY OF TERMS

● **Subjects**

The studies available in the VCE, VCE VM and VPC.

● **Study score**

A score between 0 and 50, showing how a student performed in a VCE Unit 3–4 sequence or scored VCE VET program, relative to all other students. This is calculated using the scores achieved in each of the graded assessments for the subject, 2 for VCE VET and 3 for VCE.

● **TAFE**

TAFEs offer a range of VET courses up to the level of Advanced Diploma.

● **Units (VCE, VCE VM or VPC)**

The parts of a subject in the VCE, VCE VM or VPC. There are usually 4 units in a subject.

● **Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE)**

The senior secondary qualification in Victoria.

● **Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA)**

The statutory authority responsible for providing curriculum and assessment programs for students in Victoria.

VCE GLOSSARY OF TERMS

● **Victorian Pathways Certificate (VPC)**

A foundation secondary qualification designed for students who would benefit from an individualised program at a more accessible level than a senior secondary certificate.

● **Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA)**

Victoria's education and training regulator.

● **Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC)**

Calculates and distributes the ATAR and processes tertiary entrance applications.

● **VCE Vocational Major (VCE VM)**

A 2-year vocational and applied learning program within the VCE, with specific subjects designed to prepare students for a vocational pathway.
